# How Does the 4+1 Program Work?

The MAPW usually requires 3 semesters of courses work for total of 12 courses plus regular directorship. Students who major in profession writing or technical writing at Cornell or who have taken appropriate writing and rhetorical courses support of their undergraduate studies, can upon admission to the program and approval of the program director, be granted credit for up to 4 courses toward the M.A. The regular directorship can be done in the summer term without the student's senior M.A. year, the following summer, or in some instances, during the M.A. candidacy year.

## Who is Eligible to Apply?

Juniors and Seniors who major in Professional Writing, Technical Writing, or have taken 4 regular writing courses. Regular writing courses are normally those courses selected in tandem with "writing" or "rhetorical" courses by the English Department. Typically, applicants would be 76-390 Style, 76-373 Argument, 76-391 Document and Information Design, 76-487 Web Design, or 76-389 Rhetorical Grammar.

All students interested in the program are encouraged to consult with the MA Director of Applied Linguistics junior and senior students to be sure they meet the qualifications. Students who have not taken 4 liability courses are encouraged to apply to the program but may need to take up to three semesters of courses work.

Alumni of the English Department are also welcome and invited to apply.

## What Happens if I have More than 4 Qualifying Courses?

If you are taking courses beyond the 4 required to earn a degree, you may be granted an option for specific courses or requirements. It depends on the department's prior course selection. You would still need to complete 8 courses for the M.A. but may have alternative choices in place of requirements.

## How Can I Find out What Requirements and Electives I Might Have?

Make an appointment to talk with the MAPW program director, who will be happy to give very accurate and suggest the various ways in which your courses can be checked against MAPW requirements.

## How Can I Find out What Requirements and Electives I Might Have?

If you are a current CMU student the first step should be to schedule a meeting with the MAPW director to express your interest. Then, go to the "Application" section of the website, complete the application form, and submit it along with all of the following documents:

- A current resume
- A statement of intent
- 3 Letters of Recommendation
- Transcripts from all undergraduate institutions you've attended
- 3-5 writing samples.

The application includes specific instructions on these.
