

	Describes how one identifies one's gender, independent of how the individual expresses or embodies said identification. A person's gender identity may shift across time and space. However, these shifts do not mean one's gender identity is any less real or meaningful.
	Nondiscriminatory language usage that can apply equal to people of any gender identity.
	A gender expression descriptor that indicates a non-traditional gender presentation (masculine woman or feminine man). Also used as a gender identity label that indicates a person who identifies outside of the gender binary. Often abbreviated as "GNC."
	Societal norms regarding how men and women should behave, expecting people to have personality characteristics and/or act a certain way based on their assigned sex at birth.
	<p>This term denotes how some people intentionally queer, or destabilize, their gender identity, expression, and embodiment. A gender identity label often used by people who do not identify with the binary of man/woman.
